
EXERCISE 2.2 – CREATING AND EDITING A WEB PAGE

In this Exercise, you will create a Web page. You will have an opportunity to work with this file in class.

Note: You will need to have completed Exercise 2.1 to proceed.

PART 1. CREATING A WEB PAGE

1. Be sure Dreamweaver is running
 - a. In the **Files** Control Panel, be sure the "Tea Castle" Site is visible
 - i. If not, click **Site > Manage Sites...**
 - ii. Select "Tea Castle" from the list of sites
 - iii. Click **Done**
2. From the Dreamweaver menu, click **File > New**
 - a. This will open the "New Document" window
3. From the left-hand column, click **Blank Page**
4. From the "Page Type:" column, click **HTML**
5. From the "Layout:" column, click **<none>**
6. Be sure "DocType:" displays "XHTML 1.0 Transitional"
7. Click **Create**
8. Notice that this creates a window called "Untitled-1"
 - a. If you have opened other pages, the window may be called "Untitled-2", or "Untitled-98", depending on how many pages you've created since opening Dreamweaver

PART 2. SAVE THE WEB PAGE

9. Save the page by clicking **File > Save**
10. In the "Save As:" text box, name the file "Jabberwocky.html"
11. Make sure that the "Where:" dropdown displays the root of your Web site ("Tea Castle")
12. Leave all other settings the as the default
13. Click **Save**

PART 3. ADDING CONTENT

In this section you will add content to the Web page. Note that step 14 is critical. If you do not add an appropriate Title, the page will be forever known as "Untitled Document".

14. In the "Title" text box, replace "Untitled Document" with "The Jabberwocky – by Lewis Carroll"

a. Click **File > Save**

15. Open a browser (Internet Explorer, Firefox, etc.)

a. Navigate to www.montet.org/wtc

b. Click on the "Dreamweaver I" link

c. Under "Week 2", click on the "Jabberwocky.txt" link

i. This will open up the txt file in the browser

16. Select all of the text

a. Click **Edit > Select All**

17. Copy the text to your Clipboard

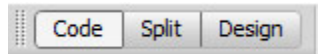
a. Click **Edit > Copy**

18. Return to Dreamweaver

19. Change your Document View to "Code"

a. You can do this by clicking **View > Code**

b. But it is faster to simply click the "Code" button in the document



20. Find the <body> tag

a. It will probably be on line "8"

21. Place your cursor immediately after the <body> tag

a. Hit the Return key on your keyboard

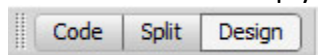
22. Paste the text you copied from the .txt file

a. Click **Edit > Paste**

23. Switch to "Design" view

a. You can do this by clicking **View > Design**

b. But it is faster to simply click the "Design" button in the document



24. Notice how the code runs together in design view

25. Save your page by clicking **File > Save**
